NOTICE OF TRESPASS

You are hereby notified of your unauthorized entry upon or use of private property. Irrigation canals and ditches and associated banks, roadways, gates and appurtenant structures (irrigation facilities) are private property not open for use by the public for any purpose without consent of the affected landowners and irrigation company. Request is hereby made to cease any further use of the irrigation facilities.

Unauthorized entry upon private property is considered trespass. Trespass includes attempted use of the irrigation facilities for recreational purposes, storage of trash or personal property, dumping of trash or debris into the canals, the construction or installation of improvements or plantings, and any attempted use of the irrigation facilities as a means of access. You are further notified that the irrigation facilities may be hazardous because of fast-flowing cold water, steep canal banks, underwater hazards, siphons, spillways, bridges and conduits. Don't risk the safety of yourself or others by use of the irrigation facilities.

The irrigation companies wish to protect and preserve the intended use of the irrigation facilities by authorized persons and to protect and preserve the health and safety of the general public. Continued violation of this notice of trespass may result in legal action. Which can include summons for trespass and or court action.

This notice of trespass is provided through the cooperation of the following: Mesa County Sheriff's Department, City of Grand Junction Police Department, Grand Valley Irrigation Company, Redlands Water and Power Company, Grand Valley Water User's Association, Orchard Mesa Irrigation District, and Mesa County Safety Council.
